CAMEY TIMBERLAKE DILLON



Camey Timberlake Dillon starred on the tennis court at an early age. At age 14 she won the North Carolina state crown for her age group in both singles and doubles, and repeated the feat at 16. At age 18, she won the 18 singles and doubles, the womens' singles and doubles, and mixed doubles for an astounding five state championships in one year. In 1974, she won the Southern closed 18 year old championship. On graduating from Lexington Senior High

School, Camey made history by becoming the first woman to receive an athletic scholarship at the University of North Carolina, also becoming the first woman to do so in the Atlantic Coast Conference. She continued to star on the court at Chapel Hill. Upon graduation Camey remained close to the court, serving as a tennis pro at the Olde Providence Racquet Club in Charlotte, the Faculty Club at Chapel Hill, and the Hamilton Lakes Tennis Club in Greensboro.
