

CHARLES RICHARD "DICK" CLINE

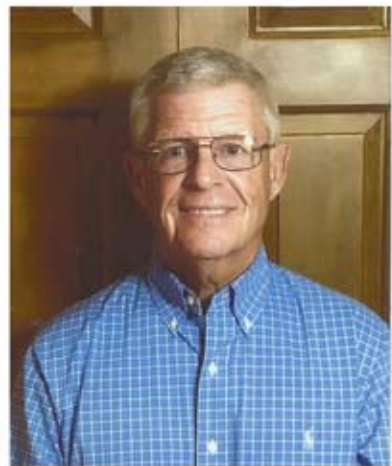
If you are looking for a coach who can turn your football program around in a heartbeat, then Dick Cline is your man.

In 32 years of coaching high school football teams, from Ledford (twice) to Ragsdale to North Davidson to Kernersville Glenn, Cline has posted a sterling career record as head coach of 264-108.

Those years also saw only one losing season along the way. A total of 10 former assistant coaches who served under him went on to become head football coaches, and five of his players went on to play in the National Football League.

That's pretty heady stuff.

In 1984, he guided Ragsdale to the 3-A Division II state championship. He was named as an assistant West coach in the annual East/West All-Star game in 1992, and twice as an assistant North Carolina coach in the Shrine Bowl (1993 and 1994).



In 2004, Cline was named as the head coach for North Carolina in the Shrine Bowl.

A product of East Davidson High School (1965-69), Cline earned his chops as a two-time all-conference player for the Golden Eagles, where he was named outstanding offensive lineman twice.

He was also all-conference in baseball for two years.

He played football for one season at Elon College, and then transferred to High Point College (1970-73).

Cline and his wife, Kathy, have four adult children: Christy, 45; Ashley, 43; Ben, 35, and Erin, 25.
