

## DANIELLE GLOSSON



Every once in a while, there comes an athlete who sets the bar for all the others that follow.

In the early 2000s, just a handful of years after the North Carolina High School Athletic Association replaced slow pitch varsity softball with the fast pitch game, North Davidson's Danielle Glosson clearly was the person who reset the bar in Davidson County.

Behind the tutelage of head coach Mike Lambros and pitching coach Billy "Chief" Gerald, Glosson became one of the most dominant pitchers in Davidson County.

In her four-year career at North, Glosson posted a career record of 92-15 with a career earned run average of 0.37. She also ranks third in North Carolina history with 1,346 strikeouts, along with 26 career no-hitters and eight perfect games.

She helped North Davidson to a 4-A state runner-up finish in 2006 and a third-place finish in 2007.

She was named EA Sports second-team all-American in her junior and senior seasons, all-Central Piedmont Conference for four years and a three-time most valuable player.

Glosson continued her pitching career at Southern Illinois where she posted a 67-40 record for the Salukis. She had a four-year earned run average of 2.25. She was the Missouri Valley Conference pitcher of the year in 2010.

In 2011, Glosson was hired as an assistant softball coach at Western Carolina. She is currently at High Point University where she is the Director of Development for Events, responsible for fundraising for High Point University athletics.
