
GEORGE FEEZOR – Posthumous



Back in the day when slow pitch softball was king in many recreation departments across the state, no teams struck terror in the hearts of their opponents more than those of Fab Masters.

From the 1970s and into the early 1980s, Fab Masters dominated the Lexington Recreation Department's Men's Industrial and Open Leagues. Several Fab Masters teams also dominated leagues in Winston-Salem, Greensboro and High Point.

George Feezor was the founding father of those teams, created in 1971 after he established Fab Masters Inc. in 1969. His softball teams went on to win more than 400 tournaments and competed in seven national championships.

Fab Masters of Winston-Salem were ASA Class C World Tournament qualifiers in 1982, featuring many players from Davidson County.

Perhaps unknown to many folks, Feezor played semipro fast pitch softball for 14 years prior to establishing Fab Masters, pitching for 14 years in Winston-Salem leagues.

Feezor was a major benefactor to West Davidson High School, providing funding for a baseball field and concession stands. He also donated to local fundraisers and athletic programs.
