### PERRY TUTTLE

Perry Tuttle's road to the National Championship and beyond started on the gridirons of northern Davidson County. The star receiver garnered All State and All American recognition while at North Davidson High School. His senior season found him starring in the Shrine Bowl. Breaking the hearts of North Carolina college coaches, Perry signed on with Clemson University. In his tenure as a Tiger, Perry grabbed onto 150 career receptions for more than 2,500 total yards, including 52 catches in 1981. Clemson fans will never forget his game winning reception in the 1982 National Championship, clinching victory over Nebraska, resulting in a 12-0 season for the Tigers. Following graduation, Perry spent time with Buffalo, Atlanta, and Tampa Bay in the NFL before moving over to the CFL. Perry established himself as one of the all time greats of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, snagging 321 passes for 5,851 yards in his seven years with the team, earning him a slot in the Blue Bombers' Hall of Fame.
