

WOODY HUNEYCUTT

There's likely been nobody more efficient at winning state high school basketball championships in Davidson County than Thomasville's Woody Huneycutt.

Get a load of this: Under his guidance, the Bulldogs won 2-A state titles in 1998, 2000, 2003, 2005 and 2007. Whoa. You can add to that a total of six regional championships, 11 sectional championships and 16 conference championships (including 14 straight from 1995 to 2008) in a coaching career that spanned 21 years.

Not surprisingly, he was named Coach of the Year 11 times. He posted a career record of 429-128.

He was also the head coach for the West All-Star team in the East-West game in 2006.

As if that wasn't impressive enough, he became Thomasville's athletic director in 2000 until 2013, and in that span he oversaw 13 state championships, including four in girls' basketball, four in boys' basketball, four in football and one in soccer.



Huneycutt was named as the National Federation of High Schools Southeast Coach of the Year in 1998 and received the North Carolina High School Athletic Association Regional Award in 2008.

He also coached Thomasville Middle School basketball, including 16 years as head coach, and softball for eight years.

Huneycutt is a 1975 graduate of Thomasville High School and a 1980 graduate of High Point University. He and his wife, Susan, are the parents of two grown daughters: Laura Kristen, 28, and Kyndal Brooke Hubbard, 24.
